

Elizabeth City Is Easily Accessible To World Famous Pleasure Resorts And Points of Historical Interest—Within a Few Hours Ride of The Great Busy Northern Centers. A City of Home-lovers

Elizabeth City's accessibility to big cities has been a big factor in its progress. It is the first large town in North Carolina from Norfolk. Any Sunday Elizabeth City people may take a train after breakfast and be in the great Virginia port with its nearby summer resorts for a day; on holidays and for short recreation periods they have the advantages that Norfolk, Washington, and Baltimore present within easy means and a few hours' travel.

Norfolk and Portsmouth, the twin cities are most interesting places. They are both closely associated with the early history of the Nation. It was early in the eighteenth century, around 1705, that Norfolk was founded. The visitor there finds specimens of colonial architecture along with the most modern of business structures, magnificent dwellings and elegant churches. It is one of the railroad centers of the country, as well as one of the principal seaports of the Atlantic Coast. Together with Portsmouth it forms an objective point, for the Atlantic Coast Line, Seaboard Air Line, Norfolk Southern, Southern, Virginian, Norfolk & Western, and the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroads, great systems

all. The suburbs contain many beautiful homes. Ocean View and Virginia Beach are popular resorts connected by trolley lines with Norfolk. Cape Henry is also within a short trolley line of Norfolk. There is the famous old light house erected in 1639, near the spot where the first English settlers came ashore. At Portsmouth is the navy yard, one of the greatest in the country, with an immense dry dock, and employing thousands of men. Marine barracks, the St. Helena naval training station and Fortress Monroe, one of the largest coast artillery posts in the United States, are points of interest. The big fort is at Old Point Comfort, where is also located the Chamberlin hotel, a famous hostelry.

One writer describes life at Old Point Comfort: "For pleasure seekers who select Old Point Comfort for their sailing, fishing, hunting, driving and for trips to the many points of interest in and near Hampton Roads (in which the navies of the world could be harbored), a constant round of pleasure is in store by them by day; and in the evening the brilliantly lighted ballroom of the magnificent Chamberlain hotel, with the inspiring music of

its splendid orchestra invites them to social gaiety.

"The proximity of Fortress Monroe makes it a delightful rendezvous. At every corner the old fortress presents picturesque features of interest, while the evolutions of the garrison, beginning in the morning and closing with dress parade in the evening daily, attract throngs of visitors. From the ramparts the spectator beholds the beautiful harbor of Hampton Roads, which ever affords a very fascinating marine picture. Coming and going are craft of all kinds destined for ports in the various parts of the world, and a fleet of Uncle Sam's warships is almost ever in plain sight, as well as frequently warships of foreign nations. Steamers from a score of cities touch daily at the piers, landing hundreds of passengers, some of whom have been coming to Old Point Comfort since they were children, following the example of their parents before them."

At Old Point Comfort connection is made for Richmond, either by rail or by steamer. Landings on the Ware, East, Severn and North rivers and Mobjack bay are also made by boats leaving the point on reg-
