ABETH CITY AND THE GRADED SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The tax books for the year of 1916 have been placed in my hands for collection of taxes and I want to cal your attention to the new city charter making it obligatory upon me to add two per cent o all taxes unpaid by the first day

December 1916, and three per the more to all taxes unpaid by the arst day of January 1916, making the penalty five per cent for de inquents January first. \$1.25 to \$1.30 The law does not require this notice. but as it has not been in force heretofore I am giving this notice 24c. there can be no just cause of complaint from those who have not known of the new law
