**WESTER UNION ANNOUNCES EXTENDED SERVICE**

**Usefulness of Telegraphic Money Transfer Service Increased By New Regulations**

During the past few years the Western Union Telegraph Company has been in the van of public service corporations in putting out new services to meet modern business and social demands. The company now announces another innovation for the service of its patrons. The Western Union Company annually transfers by telegraph an enormous amount of money and heretofore the senders of money have not been permitted to include in the transfers any communication of a business or personal character to the payee, such information being required to be sent by separate message. Under the new arrangements, however, transfers between points in the United States may include such information and the same will be delivered to the payee at the time the transfer is paid. This surely represents an up to date service and one that should appeal to and be of much value to the business houses and the public generally. Through it people will be enabled to transmit money quickly with proper instructions to meet banking obligations, pay insurance policies, guarantee purchases, accompany bids, purchase railroad, theatre and steamship tickets, pay taxes, assessments and bills of all descriptions, make remittances to traveling salesmen and pupils attending distant school etc. There is practically no limit to the purposes for which this service is available. The Telegraph Company is to be commended upon the manner in which it is broadening the scope and purpose of its various services in order to better meet the needs of the public.

**DR. E. W. SYKES ELECTED PRESIDENT COKER COLLEGE**

Wake Forest, February 24—Dr. E. W. Sykes, dean of Wake Forest College and Professor of Political Economy and History for the past eighteen years, was elected to the presidency of Coker College—a woman's college located in Hartsville South Carolina, yesterday at a meeting of the board of trustees. Dr. Sykes will remain at Wake Forest until the close of the present term and will assume his duties as President of Coker College about June 1st, following the close of the commencement at Wake Forest.

The news of Dr. Sykes' election to the presidency of Coker College does not come as a complete surprise to Wake Forest, for it has been known for some time that he has been seriously considering the matter ever since last December when the proposition was first put before him. Last week Dr Sykes informed the committee of his acceptance.

This is the second time within the period of one year that Wake Forest has had its dean and one of its professors called away to assume the presidency of a young ladies college. Dr. Charles E. Brewer being called to Meredith College last February.

The newly elected president is a native of North Carolina, being born at Monroe, in Union County. He entered Wake Forest in the fall of 1886 and five years later graduated from the M. A. degree. For the next three years he served as director of the gymnasium and acted as assistant to Dr. Charles E. Taylor in history. The only part of his life that has been spent away from Wake Forest from 1894 to 1897. He studied in John Hopkins University during that period and was awarded his Ph. D. degree in 1897. He immediately returned to Wake Forest and has occupied the chair of History and Political Economy ever since.

Dr. Sykes has taken an active part in North Carolina politics, and he is known in three fourths of the counties of the State as a speaker of rare ability. He served in the State Senate in 1911, as Senator from Wake County. He has taken a great interest in North Carolina Baptist History.

Coker College is one of South Carolina's newest institutions of learning owned by a board of trustees appointed by nine Baptist associations of South Carolina. It is the only college in South Carolina west of Columbia and north of Charleston which practically means that it is the only one in the eastern half of the State. The present valuation of the college's property is about \$600,000, with buildings now being constructed to cost \$120,000. It has an endowment of \$245,000. It is located in the quiet country town of Hartsville, which has a population of 3,000.
