Georgia has been building roads with her state convicts for nearly three years and the tak of motorists coming through Georgia to Asheville indicates the enormous value of this policy of road building. Motorists state that they can drive from f rty to sixty miles in Georgia without changing the gears of their machine.

Every one adm'ts that good roads attract much apital.

Virginia is also adopting the system of working state convicts on their public roads. North Caro'ina should not be behind in this important movement.
