The vast amount of money spent for whisky diverted into other chanels will assist greatly the development of the State and add to its permanent wealth in tax paying property, not to say anything about the wholesome effect on labor of all classes. If this can be accomplished by prohibition, and temperance people point to the prosperity of those communities where it has been rigidly enforced as a convincing argument, a state prohibition law will not only prove a moral blessing to the State but will aid greatly in its industrial progress.

The ways of Governor Glenn are sometimes as inscrutable as those of providence. As, witness his reprieving Frazier Jones for 10 days within a half hour of the execution, and after Jones had said his last prayers and prepared for death, and coupling with the reprieve the statement that he did not intend to commute the sentence to life imprisonment. If he will not commute the death sentence it was wrong to arouse a hope in the mind "of the condemned murderer, and bordering on cruel to have him again undergo the awful agony of preparing to meet his fate.
