A large saw mill, that supplies much of the lumber used in Dare County is operated by the C W. Pritchett Lumber Company Charlie W. Pritchett is well known in Dare County, and most of his manufactured output comes to Dare cach week.

Mr. Pritchett's modern mill, is located on Little Alligator creek, and is accessible by both truck and boat. It consumes a great amount of logs, being busy most of the time, and a force of 50 men is required to do the work required to fill his contracts for lumber The mill itself keeps seven men busy! all the time. It will saw 10,000 feet of lumber a day, and 15,000 shingles.
