Mr. Warren has been called "The Guardian Angel of the Coast Guard." because of his zeal in looking after the interests of the men of this service, and as a result of his long labors in their behalf and his knowledge of the men and their situation, he was made Chairman of a Sub-Committee jundling legislation affecting the Coast Guard, Lighthouse and Coast and Geodetic Survey. In many instances he has brought to the attention of the department men deserving promotion, and now he is working to increase the sustenance allowance of en-listed men to \$100 a day.
