WHY ATLANTIC FISH ARE FOUND IN PACIFIC

Panama Canal traffic is not confined to big ships and little boats. Fishes, both big and little, use the locks in passage from ocean to ocean—and never pay any tolls.

Dr. Samuel F. Hildebrand, of the United States Bureau of Fisheries, has made a detailed study of the fish found in the canal when the locks are dewatered, and reports 159 species ranging in size from anchovies to tarpon, as well as crabs, shrimp and several other kinds of invertebrates.

Not all the 159 species are known to pass through the canal. It isn't all plain sailing for the fish.
