The Sénate has passed the bill for a 25 per cent. increase in the sala ries of United States judges Amendments to increase salaries of Congressmen were on the contrary voted down. Both the passage of the bill of the defeat of the amendments were wise moves. The re quirement that a judge should be impartial in all his discussions, ne cessitates sufficient salary to keep him from dependence on others; the giving up of his practice calls for a good remuneration; and upon these points depend to a considerable ex tent the in lependence and ability of the judiciary. On the other hand the member of congress goes there not to secure livelihood but to secure honor or influence; his election does not usually make it nocessary that he give up his business or pro fession; the nature of his position as a partisan permits him to accept from fellow partisans the assistance in financial matters which a candi date for judiciary office could not well receive. Under the circumstances a change in salary would make no material difference in the make up of congress, while adequate salary will ensure a higher degree of efficiency in the judiciary. ideals.




