### MUST RAISE PRICE OF SERUM

LABORATORY OF RALEIGH PRODUCES AND FURNISHES THIS PRODUCT AT LOWEST POSSIBLE PRICE TO FARMERS

 The State Department of Agriculture has for the past several years been manufacturing the anti-cholera serum. This anti-cholera serum has been compared by legislative action to advance the price of the product from three quarters of one cent per cubic centimeter to one cent per cubic centimeter.  
 The effect of this will be to make it cost a trifle more to vaccinate a hog, and thus render him immune against cholera, than it has been costing for the past two years. Under the price at which the State manufactured serum has been costing during the past two years, the cost per hog ranged from about 8 cents for a little pig, up to about 75 cents for the very largest of

hogs. At the new price the cost will be from about ten cents for a very small pig, up to, about \$1.00 for the largest of hogs.

However, even at this newly established price, the state government will be selling the serum to residents of this state at about three quarters of the cost of manufacture.  
 In making the anti-cholera serum it is necessary to have a large number of shots, of about 100 pounds gross weight, and the price of hogs has been constantly advancing, that has been the greatest factor in the advance of the price. Hogs are now selling for from \$12.00 to \$15.00 per hundred pounds live weight, as against a former price of from \$7.00 to \$11.00 per hundred pounds.

In the winter of 1916-1917, the Veterinary Division of the State Department of Agriculture began, in a small way, to make this hog cholera serum in an improvised laboratory in Raleigh, and first sold the product at 2 1/2 cents per cubic centimeter, barely enough to cover the cost of manufacture at that time.  
 A few months later after the laboratory had become well organized and better methods were introduced, it was possible to procure the serum at two cents per cubic centimeter, and the price was promptly reduced.  
 Still later more improvements were made, and the volume of serum manufactured became much larger.


