REVOLUTION MAKES PROFOUND IMPRESSION

Both Germany And Austria Deeply Stirred by Developments at Petrograd Regarded as Unfavorable to German Autocracy.

Amsterdam, March 17—Unrest in Germany against the militaristic repression of the people has been violently accelerated by the success of the Russian people in removing the yoke of centuries.

Even Germans who have always favored autocratic rule of the fatherland have been deeply affected seeing now the failure of German plans and realizing the certainty that Russia, under its new government will be animated by a stronger purpose and by a more unified discrimination to do its best against Germany.

Officials Return to Vienna Dispatches from Vienna state that the revolution created a profound impression there. That the German government does not regard the impression as favorable to the continuance of the Prussian military autocracy is indicated in the return of the Emperor to Vienna and in the departure of Hofburg from Berlin to Vienna.

Recognize Authority of Duma All army officers at Petrograd, dispatches from the Russian capital state, met today and passed resolutions recognizing the authority of the Duma. Speeches were made stating realization on the part of the army of the need of the speedy reestablishment of order and authority that her work behind the trenches may proceed.

Referendum to People Grand Duke Michael is willing to abdicate the throne of Russia only in case of referendum to the vote of the people. This fact suggests that his form of government will be approved throughout Russia.

Czar a Prisoner The Czar is a prisoner of revolutionists in Tauride Palace. The Czar Nicholas was sent to Kiev. Former Prince Kollitz is reported to have succumbed in prison.

Attitude of London Reports from London state that the British government is dealing with the provisional committee of the Duma in Russia as a definite Russian government.

New York March 17—"The strike is postponed for forty-eight hours" Secretary Lane announced late this afternoon.

"At our request and out of appreciation of the national situation the Brotherhood and railroad managers have resumed negotiations in the hope that some adjustment may be made which will make it possible to avoid the strike altogether."

"If at the end of forty eight hours no agreement has been reached the men will leave again in order their former orders."

The announcement was signed "Lane, Willard, Wilson."

New York March 17—Federal mediators and Brotherhood chiefs went into conference today at 9:30 in the final effort to avert the strike scheduled to start tonight.

"We are working earnestly and sincerely to find a solution of the problem" Secretary of Labor Lane said. "We will see that the Brotherhoods first, and after that will see the representatives of the railroads."

Asked if all three bodies would meet together afterward, he said, "We may, but that is not yet decided. Various plans are under consideration and we want to find out what the two sides want. They have been fighting it out between themselves, with great ability on both sides for some time."

Asked if there had been a split to get together shown on either or both sides, Secretary Lane said "There has been on my part," Lane explained, "a late breakfast was the reason for a mixup which caused the Brotherhood chiefs to report at the Baltimore, when they found no trace of the mediators with whom they had the 4:30 appointment."

At two o'clock Secretary Lane said that he expected to have an important announcement to make at three, adding that the situation was very hopeful.
