Wasington, May 14 .- The President today authorized four additional increments for the regular army. approximating 183,000 men.

In most cases one regiment of already trained regulars will be used as the basis of formation with two regiments of recruits. The odds are that the regular army is about filled with its full war quota of three hundred thousand men. Nearly sixty-five thousand have recruited since the first of

# HOLD CONFERENCE PASOUDIANK'S PEA GROP MOVING

FIRST SHIPMENT WENT FOR WARD LAST MONDAY, SEASON IS ON IN FULL BLAST THIS WEEK

The season for shipping May peas is on in full blast here this week, and in spite of continued cool weather this movement of trucking crops lends an air of real May time to town and country life in this section.

Thirty-six baskets of May Peas made up one shipment by Spence and Hollowell today from Mr. Wiley Gregory. On May 10th this firm shipped their first peas. These were grown by Mr. W. K. Parsons of Nixonton.

R C Abbott made the first shipment of the season, just a week ago today. These were grown by S Waters and Co., and brought \$2.50 a backet. Mr Abbott has made a number of shipments since last Monday and expects to make a great many this week. The Newbern Produce Company began shipping peas today also.

This is one of the earliest trucking crops of the section, and one that always attracts visitors who have lived in other sections where May peas are not grown at all or are grown only for home use. Clean and tender and fresh in their bright green pods. May Peas lack the dirt and rot and the overabundance that sometimes accompany the potato shipping season.
