Boches Give Up Voluntarily

Reports Reach Washington Weakening of German Morale in East. In Flanders Germans Prepare To Retreat.

Washington, August 11.—Hundreds of Austro-German Gorgas made clear today when he troops are surrendering themselves voluntarily to the Russians, according to cables received here by the Russian Embassy.

This evidence of the weakening of the German morale is strengthened by additional cables stating that Kaiser Wilhelm visited the German troops at Nitsu and pleaded with them for continued loyalty.
