## Allied Defense is Firm Before Long Heralded Drive of German Arms Dr. S. Parkes Cadman to De NoW Launched in Full Force

With the Fritish Armies in France, March 22 .- The British troops are holding the Germans everywhere and driving them back slong some parts of the line, the latest reports indi-

The Germans began their long advertised offensive yesterday attacking in tremendous force.

At least nineteen divisions of the enemy have been identified in the attack.

By noon yesterday they had succeeded in penetrating the first and second trench defense system.

At five o'clock in the afternoon they delivered a powerful blow on the northwest front but the machine gun fire mow ed down the advancing columns and checked the advance.

Airmen on both sides are handicapped by foggy weather.
