First Lieut, Frank A. Owens, 4th Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Les Evaux, France July 13, 1918. After several unsuccessful attempts had been made to get patrols across the Marne River at night, Lieut. Owens and two soldiers, crossed in daylight and remained on the enemy side throughout the day. Corpl. John M. Baker, Company G. 4th Infantry. (A. S. No. 2333045.) For extraordinary heroism in action near Ronchares, France, July 23th. 1918. Corpl. Seeing all the members of his patrol lying about. either killed or wounded, he courageously continued the fire, killing a sniper who had been inflicting severe losses.
