## DAYLIGHT SAVING IN THE BIG CITIES

### Clocks Will be Set Ahead One Hour Sunday Morning in New York and 32 Other American Cities

(By Associated Press.)  
New York, March 27.—Daylight saving will get into effect at two o'clock Sunday morning in New York, 32 American cities and towns, not including the city of Chicago, which has already adopted the new system. The cities which will observe the new system are: Albany, Ala., Annapolis, Ark., Baltimore, Bismarck, Bismarck, N. D., Boston, Buffalo, N. Y., Chicago, Cleveland, Conn., Dallas, Tex., Denver, Colo., Detroit, Mich., Evansville, Ind., Hartford, Conn., Indianapolis, Ind., Jacksonville, Fla., Kansas City, Mo., Knoxville, Tenn., Louisville, Ky., Memphis, Tenn., Miami, Fla., Milwaukee, Wis., Minneapolis, Minn., New Orleans, La., New York, N. Y., Norfolk, Va., Omaha, Neb., Philadelphia, Pa., Pittsburgh, Pa., Portland, Me., Richmond, Va., St. Louis, Mo., St. Paul, Minn., St. Petersburg, Fla., Toledo, Ohio, and Washington, D. C.

"We do not believe any information," said E. W. M. Marks, president of the organization that has been fighting for daylight saving.

The time adopted by New York City, for instance, will be automatically observed by all cities and towns within a radius of 50 miles or more of the metropolis. The same can be said of Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. The railroads are preparing to operate their local trains so as to take care of the commuters in the territory affected. Cleveland last year operated on time an hour ahead of that of contiguous territory but there was no confusion there.

The state-wide daylight saving bill, recently passed by the New Jersey assembly and which is now before the senate for ratification, is reported to have been ordered by nearly all the states. It is also said to have been passed by the legislatures of New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

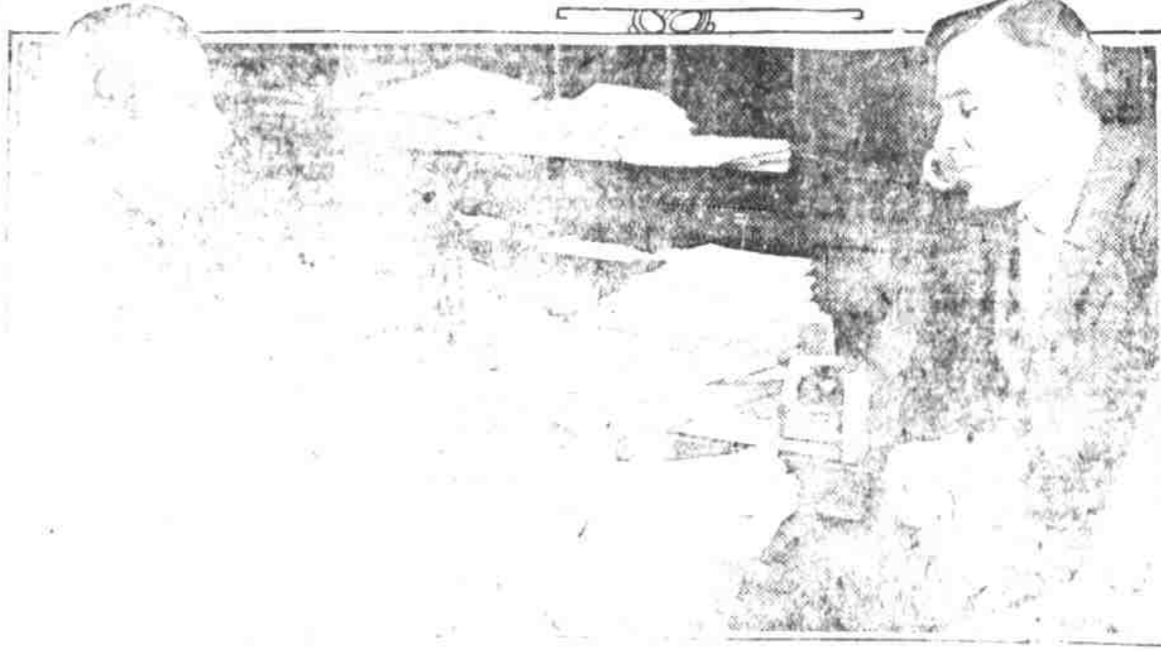

## Speaks From Story Naaman The Leper

We Want To Be Saved Our Own Way And Not God's Way Is The Trouble Says Mr. Ormond.

The protracted services which are being held nightly at the First Methodist Church, are growing in interest and attendance and a spiritual stimulus of consuming proportion is more and more pervading the gathering. Notwithstanding the inclement weather of Friday evening, the assembled congregation comfortably filled the church. Mr. Frank Hafla, a musical director of splendid ability and talent, is leading the singing and together with the choir of splendid voices which he has organized, is giving those who attend a treat in sacred, soul inspiring songs.

The Pastor, Rev. J. M. Ormond, spoke from the story of "Naaman the Leper." "Sin is to the world what leprosy was to Naaman's body," said the speaker, and continued: "If the world would accept God at His word and do as He commands, it would be such as was Naaman leprosy after his healing." Obedience was stressed by the speaker. "We want to be saved our own way, the easiest way, instead of God's way, and this will never be. We must accept God's way and do as His commands."

"Many people have repudiated the religion of Jesus Christ. They expect to be saved in some other fashion than through His blood. They rely upon social standing, upon wealth and influence and upon other man-created powers, but these will be found of no avail in our behalf.
