APPROVES LOAN TO RAILROADS

Interstate Commerce Commission Would Help Railroads Purchase Necessary Equipment For Present Needs

Washington, May 21 - A loan of at least 125,000,000 out of a revolving fund of \$300,000,000 to enable railroads to putchase equipment required to meet transportation needs was approved by the Interstate Commerce Commission today.
