The Advance is prompted to ask this question because th Federal Department of Agr culture tells us that the South produces and consumes only three fifths as much milk as th North and West; and physicians tell us that the milk sup ply of Eastern North Carolina is certainly not adequate to the needs of its children. Eastern North Carolina imports and uses vast quantities of conden ed milk to feed its babies.
"Children fed on condensed cian of this section, "have poor resistance and are subject to all diseases, especially diarrheal troubles. Their mortal ity from these diseases is three times as great as for those fed on cow's milk. The death rate from bowel dizeases among children in North Carolins is fifty per higher than in the rest of the United States,
