
## Poet Mixes Dream Cake

Citizens of Bloomington, Ill., who had known him when he was a young lawyer and later when he was campaigning for the Senate, sathered in mass meeting to voice their horror over his tragic death. "A Life for a Life," they demanded when John Wilkes Booth's name was mentioned. Similar gatherings were held in every city of any consequence throughout the nation. But as far as can be accertained, this picture, hanging today in the Bloomington Public Library, is the only photographic evidence that yet remains of any of them.
