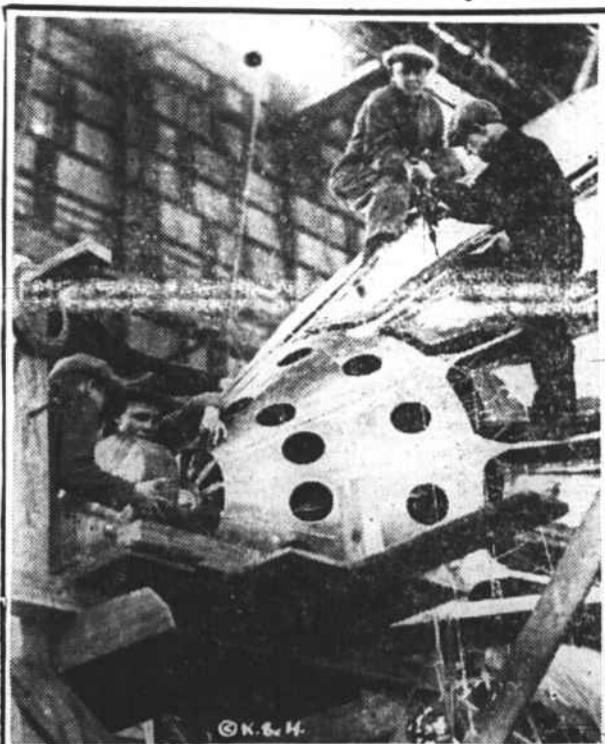
Misses Ruby and Mildred Bright of Elizabeth City spent the Easter holidays with Mrs. C. Bright.

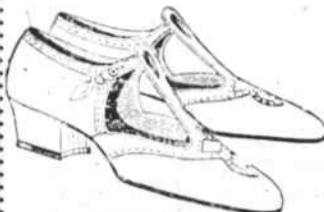

**CALIFORNIA POTATOES ARE COMING EAST SOON**

San Francisco, Apr. 29—(Special)—The elimination of embargoes by other states because of the foot and mouth disease is expected to furnish Eastern markets with California potatoes at prices considerably below those now obtaining in the Eastern markets. Approximately 298,000 sacks of potatoes now are in cold storage here. This is about three times the amount on hand at this time last year. In addition the wharves are piled high with thousands of sacks from the up river districts.

Following assurance by government representatives that all shipments had been fully disinfected, California wool again is moving Eastward by the Panama Canal.
