Mrs. Lewis believes that mothers can often profit by probation as much or even more than-children. She believes that if a welfare officer, when forced to remove children from a mother, makes it clear to the woman that their return to her will depend upon her proper conduct, a streat deal can be accomplished. She tells of one case in which she thinks that if this, method had been followed, the woman could have been saved from subsequent increased immorality. This was before the establishment of the children's home, and it was necessary to separate her from her children permanently. 
