## Hypocritical Patronage More Damaging Than Open Opposition

**Evangelist Ham Scores Those Who Pretend Co-operation but Really Not in Sympathy with Campaign and Promises Make Hair and Hide Fly for 200 Miles**

Hypocritical patronage rather than open opposition was characterized by Evangelist M. F. Ham Sunday afternoon as the most serious hindrance to the success of the Ham-Ramsey Evangelistic Campaign which enters upon its fourth week here tomorrow.

"If you don't want to close your stores for these meetings," he said, "why throw your doors wide open and make public announcement that you will close them no more during the campaign. You will do less harm than that when you will closing them up and then going around and complaining about it."

"God has always made the works of the wicked to praise him and everything that is being done or that will be done during this campaign against this meeting is going to add to its success. You people who are fighting this meeting are being patted on the back by the bootleggers, the libertines and the entire lawless element in your city. Now how do you like your crowd?"

"One man with God on his side makes a majority and when you fight this campaign you are fighting God. Four hundred and fifty priests of Baal who undertook to do that on Carmel at the end of the trial were on their backs or beheaded."

The Evangelist also paid his respects to those who have been offended at something said during the meeting, declaring that it has always been his observation that the dog that yelps was the one that had been hit.

"Now go on and yelp, you old hound, and let the people get your number. God's already got your record and he's going to pull it on one of these days."

The evangelist also declared that this was one of the very few towns in which he has worked where the society leaders had not called off their card parties and dances for the duration of the campaign as a mark of common courtesy to the churches of the community.

"You don't even know the ordinary demands of etiquette," he said. "Yours is a little cheap dishwashing-type of society. Now take that, you are welcome to it."

The foregoing remark was interrupted by Chorister Ramsey who wanted the folks to know that he had a book on etiquette up in his room at the hotel which he was willing to lend to anybody who would like to borrow it.

Pronfanity in the city came in for a scolding when Earl Rodgers remarked during the evangelist's introductory remarks Sunday afternoon that he had been on the Mexican border when the World War opened and knew something about the profanity of the Army camps; but that he had never heard more hair-raising and foul language used anywhere than had come to his ears one night on the school ground as he was on his way to his room at the hotel from the tabernacle.

"That's no news to me," said the evangelist. "I have heard too much from the curb lizards right under my window to be surprised at that."

Mr. Ham indicated that his exhortation of local conditions Sunday was but a beginning. "For the next week I'm going to make hair and hide fly to a distance of 200 miles from here," he declared.

Despite threatening weather and a slow drizzle Sunday night the tabernacle was again twice filled on Sunday, and a delegation of a dozen or more was present from Henderson. Represented in the crowd were people from Camden, Currituck, Perquimans, Bertie and Washington counties, as well as Pasquotank, Gates being the only county contiguous to Pasquotank that was not represented. Mr. Ramsey wanted a committee sent to Gates County to investigate the reason for the failure of any Gates County people to attend the meeting. Somebody suggested that the condition of the roads was the reason, but a member of the delegation from Henderson piped up. "We came through Gates County."

The evangelist's subject Sunday afternoon was, "The Jew and His Destiny." The Jew and the Universe, Jesus Christ, the Universe, and the Jew," he said, "are four things which the philosophies of the world are unable to account for."

Sunday night's subject was "Sowing and Reaping." The report of this sermon will be given in Tuesday's issue of this newspaper.

Sunday afternoon's sermon: "He hath not dealt so with any nation." The Jews are the most ancient and the most modern people on the face of the earth. When Israel, the English statesmen, was taunted by an English lord for his Jewish birth, he replied, "Sir, my ancestors were princes and kings in the earth when yours were roving savages. You are now proud of your ancient birth, but in the veins of the meanest Jew there flows blood compared to which the blood of the proud-

Kings 7:1, making 499 years from Exodus to dedication.

### CAPTIVITY NOT COUNTED

The third period extends from the dedication of the temple 1904 B.C. to the days of Artaxerxes IV B.C., a period of 556 years. But they were in captivity in Babylon 70 of these years (Dan. 9:2 and Jer. 25:11) leaving only 120 years in which they owned

their own land. The death rate among them is 7 per 1,000 while among the Gentiles it is 14 per 1,000 yearly. Their average life is one-third longer than ours. Their life insurance is worth 20 per cent more than ours. All this is due to the fact that they have lived according to the sanitary laws given to Moses by God Almighty, and to God's purpose in creation.

### PROVE INSPIRATION OF BIBLE

When Frederick the Great asked his court preacher for an unanswerable proof of the inspiration of the Bible he answered, "The Jew, my master, the Jew." When Napoleon asked the Archbishop of Milan for the briefest possible argument for revealed religion, he silently pointed to Matthew 23:9, a Jew.

The skeptical historian, Remond, says that the philosophy of history falls utterly to account for the Jew.

Every event of their history has been foretold, and when God restores the Kingdom of Israel all the world will have to give Him

the credit.

Ended by the second coming

of Christ. Dan. 2:44-45.

"And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led captive into all the nations; and Jerusalem shall be trodden down by the Gentiles, until the time of the Gentiles be fulfilled."

Luke xvi: 24. Again, "After these things I will return and will build again the tabernacle of David which is fallen; and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up."—Acts xv: 16. And again, "For I would not, brethren, have you ignorant of this mystery, that a hardening in part hath fallen upon Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles be come in."—Rom. xi: 25.

All this time is past except the last week, or seven years, which will be in after Christ has taken the church out of the Gentile world. (See 1 Thes. iv: 15-17.)

The thousand year period will be considered after we discuss the four great missions committed to the Jewish race by God.

### A FOUR FOLD MISSION

First—To teach the world Monothelism. "Hear, O, Israel! The Lord, our God, is great God!" Deut. vi: 4.

To Israel was this primal truth committed for preservation and dissemination. She often fell into idolatry before the Babylonian captivity; but never afterwards.

At the time Abraham was called out of Ur of Chaldea, the whole world had sunk to idolatry. See also Isa. 43: 19. Inform me there was no God before me there was no God, informed, neither shall there be after me."

The only Monotheistic people on earth today were taught it by her, but the work is yet incomplete.

Second—To show the world the beauty and blessedness of obeying and serving this great God. Deut. xxix: 25, "Happy art thou, O Israel; who is like unto thee, O people, saved by Jehovah?"

Again, Psalm cxlv: 15, "Happy is that people whose God is Jehovah."

And so long as Israel kept her covenant with Jehovah he did not permit any other nation to become strong enough to menace her national existence.

Third—To write, preserve and transmit His inspired word. Every one of the forty writers of the books of the Bible was a Jew, with possibly one exception. All

the blessings of modern civilization and of law and liberty came to the world through the Jews.

Deut. iv: 5-6, "Behold, I have taught you statutes and judgments."

For this is your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the nations which have all these statutes; and surely this great nation is a wise and understanding nation. Again, Rom. III: 1-2, "What advantages then has the Jew, or what profit is there in circumcision?" Much every way; chiefly because unto them were committed the oracles of God."

Fourth—To give a Savior to the world. When the world was in moral darkness and without God and without hope, God called man, Abraham, out of a nation, Chaldea; and out of that man, Abraham, he called a nation, the Jews; and out of that nation, the Jews, he called a man, Jesus, the Christ; and out of that man, Jesus, He is calling a nation, a holy nation, the Church of the First Born.

The second period extends from the Exodus to the dedication of Solomon's Temple. Of this time (Solom. 12: 18-22), they were 40 years in the wilderness, 450 years under the judges, commanding with Joshua and ending with Samuel; 40 years under Saul, 10 years under David and three years under Solomon; making 573 years from the Exodus when he began building the temple, which was 1 Kings 6: 1, 480 years. But during this time they were in the hands of their enemies 93 years.

In Judges 6: 8-10; 14, 16: 14;

16: 2-3; vi: 1 and vii: 1 we find they were in the hands of Cushan Rishathaim 40 years, Eglon 18 years, Jabin 29 years, the Midianites 7 years and the Philistines 40 years, making the 93 years.

Subtract 93 years, 573 and you have 480 years of Jewish chronology.

1 Kings 6: 1. Add to the 180 the 7 years spent building (1 Kings 6: 30) and the 3 years furnishing (1
