

Work Urges Creation Of Federal Oil Commission

Also Declares in Annual Report that Enactment of Reclamation Program Which Failed to Get Approval in Last Congress Is an Immediate Need

Washington, Dec. 8.—Creation of a permanent Federal oil commission with a view to conservation, Congressional action on the new reclamation program, improvements in the administration of the country's island possessions, and legislation to increase the internal efficiency of the Interior Department were recommended by Secretary Work this week in his annual report.

The secretary did not discuss the oil situation at length, but he declared the formation of a commission of cabinet members to deal with it was "an urgent necessity."

He likewise touched but briefly on the new reclamation program which was worked out by a special commission but which failed of Congressional approval at the last session. Enactment of the legislation contemplated in the program, he said, was one of the tasks with which the present session should deal promptly.

He suggested that within the Interior Department itself there was need for a new Bureau of Public Works, in which all construction and engineering work could be centered. He also advocated the concentration into one department, and under one member of the cabinet, of the territorial affairs of Alaska and Hawaii.

The report contained a hint that a general overhauling of the public land laws may be recommended later to Congress. Secretary Work said a special committee was engaged in a study of these statutes, and added:

"It is probable that growth of the country and changed conditions will warrant some radical departures from established custom. The question arises whether the Government should

continue the present method of disposing of its public domain. The present law covering the acquisition of timber and stone lands on the public domain, passed in 1878, should be revised to better meet our vanishing timber in the public interest."

The results of the recent reorganization of the Pension Bureau, which clipped \$266,000 from the annual payroll and enabled the bureau to return \$56,000 of its appropriation to the Treasury, were praised by the secretary as constituting a measure both of economy and efficiency. Better results had been brought about, he said, despite the fact that 338 positions in the bureau were eliminated by the re-organization program.

It was pointed out that a special commission was studying the situation in the patent office, with a view to bringing that bureau's work up to date, and that improved methods of administration in the general land office had effected a saving of about \$85,000 during the year in its operating expenses.

Declaring the problem of directing Federal guardianship of 25,000 Indians is one of great concern to him, the secretary urged that centralized authority with decentralized responsibility is essential in the Indian service, because of the distance between the bureau in Washington and its wards.

"States should be impressed," he said, "that ultimately the Indian problem is theirs to solve, and the Government's participation should eventually be co-operative rather than initiative in character."

Describing the growing popularity of the national park system—visited last season by record crowds in spite of conditions

adverse to travel.—Mr. Work said he hoped Congress would see fit to create an outdoor playground, readily accessible to the millions of persons from densely populated centers of the East. He observed that the Western States so far have virtually a monopoly on national parks, the only one in the East being LaFayette National Park in Maine. A committee has inspected proposed sites for a national park in the Southern Appalachian Mountain region, and its recommendation will be presented to the present Congress.

An outstanding accomplishment in the Bureau of Mines during the year was said by the secretary to be the development of close cooperation with the British Mines Department, whereby the results of British experiments and research directed towards greater safety in mining will be available to American engineers, and the results of Bureau of Mines investigations will be available to the English. It was in this connection that he made his only direct reference to the oil situation.

"The production of oil from the public lands, exclusive of the naval petroleum reserves, amounted to nearly 40,000,000 barrels during the year, from which the Government obtained nearly 8,000,000 barrels of royalty oil, valued at slightly more than \$12,000,000," he said. "Of this sum 90 per cent was returned to the states, either directly or through the Reclamation Service, and the remaining 10 per cent went to the Federal Treasury to cover the cost of supervision. The actual cost is about one-third this amount, the remainder being available for general expenses of the Government. Supervising the production and gauging of the 40,000,000 barrels cost the Government only \$250,000."
