Rev. Frank H. Scattergood, pastor of Cann Memorial Presbyterian Church, Elizabeth City, has been a young man, all that and more, says today, with the same vigor on the beautiful Pamlico River and the world at his feet, that he believes he is the youngest man of his age in Elizabeth City.

Mr. Scattergood claims to be around 59, and is holding the many and varied offices at his church, acting as evangelist, and being a friendly man of person as he walks and talks on the streets every day, he has voluntarily gone to the high school and given calisthenics lessons for four periods a day on four days a week this year, as the pupils from the seventh grade through high school might not be deprived of this training because the school could not afford to pay an instructor.

While up to date in his ideas about young people, and while a good fellow and a born mixer, he is old-fashioned in his religion. His sermons are serious and scholarly. There is nothing of the sensational or the slushy in them. For Mr. Scattergood is a man of broad education and deep culture. He has degrees of many kinds from a number of higher institutions of learning. He knows books and people and life, and he insists today, with the sun shining in the Pasquotank, and life so pleasant in this corner of North Carolina, that he is the youngest man of his age most anywhere and that he expects to live to be 110 and to spend the rest of his life here in Elizabeth City.

CHURCH GIVEN OVER TO SOVIET

Minister and Russian Refugees Pray in Vain to be Saved from Advance of Bolsheviks

Oppositionists in the Soviet Union have been successful in their efforts to have the church in Pasquotank given over to the Soviet. The church was refused by the Russian community in the city, and it is which declared that the church belongs to the community and has no connection with the Russian or any other group.

The Soviet delegation brought the case to the court, which today decided that the church shall be handed over to the soviet, although the lawyer for the community would that no other country in the world might be given over to Russian churches in the soviet government.

The court said, in handing down its decision, that since the church belonged to the community, it is the property of the soviet.

According to the minister, he will have to move out of the church which will be placed at the disposal of the soviet.

While the court was making the decision, the minister, together with his Russian congregation was praying in the church that God would save their old building from the hands of the soviet, but they were in vain.

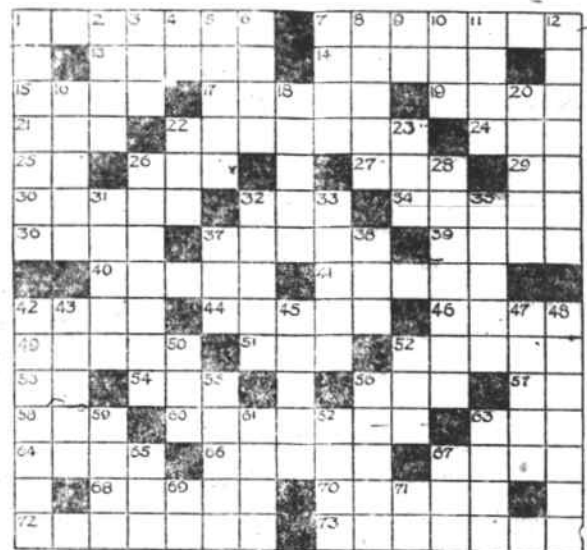
The decision will undoubtedly be brought before the supreme court.
