## BUSINESS OPENS UP ITS THROTTLE ANOTHER NOTCH

Volume Wholesale Orders and Shipments Encouraging But Retail Trade Lagging on Account Weather

## AUTO INDUSTRY BOOMS

Employment Records Broken as Buick Reaches New Levels and Others Step Up Schedules

New York, Oct. 7.—The third of business has been opened another notch in the last week and trade is rapidly reaching a new peak activity. The volume of wholesale orders and shipment increased since October 1 has been most gratifying, but the movement of retail trade has lagged the same which apparently only supports fact another can assure. This remains in two dark spots on the horizon which are becoming bluer instead of lighter. Most lines are operating at normal or better.

For the fifth consecutive week, all previous records for industrial employment in Detroit, a barometer of the automobile industry, were broken. The total employed there reached 257,894, a gain of 6,656 since January 1. The Buick factories have never been so active at present. The Chevrolet, Oldsmobile, the Motor Wheel Corporation and the Fisher Body Company are stepping up their schedules and Timken-Detroit Axle and Kelsey Wheel plants are active.

The definite improvement in the steel business is reflected in the increases to come anticipated by J. C. Keith, president of the Otto Steel Company and James A. Campbell of the Youngstown Sheet and Tube Company. "September showed a sizeable increase over July and August," Mr. Campbell said. "And I expect the volume of steel business to increase. Iron prices have advanced and the cost of coal, coke and other raw materials have increased. Ultimately this will be reflected in higher prices for finished steel."

Ois steel is running at capacity and Trumbull steel is operating at the rate of 10,000 tons of finished steel a month.

The effects of the anthracite strike are beginning to bear down on both operators and miners. The cost of keeping the mines in condition is a heavy burden and many workers reflected the effects of slanting of wages by discriminating members who accept employment at wages less than those approved by their organization. Bituminous production continues heavy.

In some isolated sections the fall set in building has made its appearance but in most communities construction continues unabated and will be aided by settlement of the bricklayers and plasterers dispute. Contractors in Florida are finishing their jobs to completion before January 1, paying bonus for overtime.

Lumber demand, production and shipments fell off from last week but no business was larger than at this time last year. Export inquiry for copper has let down and prices for the metal weakened slightly. Lead and zinc were steady with production not high enough to depress quotations. Operations have been reduced 5 to 10 per cent in some of the rubber plants owing to a cut in replacement demand but crude rubber remained strong owing to smallness of stocks.

Depression of cotton prices checked retail buying in the South but aided textile manufacturers, especially in New England. Rain which filled the streams and delayed the hydroelectric power shortage helped the Southern goods producers. Worsted mills of the American Woolen Company now are working up to about 80 per cent of capacity operation.

Demand for gas and electricity was about 15 per cent above that for the corresponding time of 1924.

Electric equipment sales are increasing and some additional plants will be converted immediately to the manufacture of electric locomotives. Tanners are expanding operation under the stimulus of firm hide and leather prices due to activity in the shoe trade. Livestock prices are firm and growers and packers probably will enjoy the best year since 1920. Petroleum production continues to load around 2,100,000 barrels weekly and while demand
