With President Hoover holding meetings with bankers, both national and international, in an effort to work out some plan by which foreign countries may be able to purchase cotton from this country to use in the manufacture of goods, and the legislature in both Texas and South Carolina getting ready to "consider" the cotton situation it is possible that the price of co ton will advance within a short time.

Oct. will probably be the first day of school. An eight month term will be instituted throughout the county except at some rural schools where the term has been cut to six months. About 33 less teachers will be employed in the county than in 1930.

Whether this is true or not and whether this is merly an effort to depress the price or not the fact remains that the price is low. If it is true that there is an enormous surplus on hand, and government reports indicate that such is true, the tobacco manufacturers are doing a pretty commendable piece of work offering to buy tobacco at any price.
