

SINGULAR PHENOMENON. I have just returned from seeing a very re-markable fact in natural history. The exhi-bition took place in the court-yard of Mr. L.

S. Coryell, of New Hope. The phenomenon to which I refer, w that of innumerable small worms, of a peru-liar appearance, forming or interlinking themselves together, in one continuous string or mass, in shape and appearance, most strikingly resembling a spike; and like a snake, moving forward together us a body.

When it was first, seen, I understand that it was about fifteen or sixteen inches long, perfectly resembling a common snake of that perfectly resembling a common snake of that size, in shape and proportion, head, neck body and tail. Before I arrived, it had been accidentally trodden upon, and broken into several fragments; and but one small portion seemed disposed to re-form. It was, believe, what had previously constituted the tail. When I first saw it, there was no resemblance whatever to a snake; but a rather confused though continuous string, about ex er seven inches long with a branch joined to it, about a third of the way from one end, and nearly as long as the shorter part of the main string, somewhat resembling, although it a letter Y. On the very next day the peasant was found dead in his village, with paper pinned on his breast with these terrible words inscribed..." This is the fate of all thou who betrayed Anichiarico." The last barn which this leader commanded was colled th "decided;" each man possessed a certificate bearing two death's heads, with bloody em blems, and the great words at "Justice, liberty, or death," signed "Aulchiarica" I wen one of the certificates in General Church's possession, which was written in homan blood At last in January, 1819, this astonishs buildit, finding himself beset on all points,
