

COMMERCIAL.

REMARKS ON MARKET. TURPENTINE.—Sales of Turpentine since Thursday are as follows, viz., 50 bbls. at \$2 25 per bbl. for Soft, and \$1.30 per bbl. for Hard, and 1,168 barrels at \$2.90 per bbl. for Soft, and \$1.30 per bbl. for Hard, market closing at the latter prices.

ROBIN AND SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—We hear of no sales of either since our last report. TIMBER.—3 Rafts were sold at these prices viz. \$8.50—\$10.50 and \$12 per M. Market nearly clear.

STAVES.—A lot of R. O. hhd. Staves was sold at \$10 per M. STUMPS.—A sale of Common Stumps, was made at \$2 per M.

So little produce arriving, our remarks are consequently short.

NEW YORK MARKET. April 23. Cotton.—The market, since the departure of the Baltic on Wednesday last, has been dull with a tendency downward; this has been more especially observable the past three days, and we now reduce our quotations fully 1/4 of a cent per lb. prices still favoring buyers.

Flour.—Southern has been in good demand for the West Indies and for home use at previous prices, the market closing very firmly, with but little for fancy brands. Bye Flour has been dull, with small sales at \$3.75.

Corn as been offered more freely, and as the Canal is now navigable and receipts will soon come forward, the market has been depressed, and closes heavily at a considerable reduction in prices; the sales are 78,000 bushels, closing at 67 1/2 cts for round Yellow, 67 1/2 cts for Southern White, which continues very scarce and wanted.

Naval Stores.—Are without any material change, except that the market is better supplied by the arrival of a fleet of vessels from North Carolina. The sales are 1,000 bbls. North County Turpentine at \$3.20 No. 2, \$1.45 No. 1, North County Common, about \$1.18, \$1.21, \$1.25, \$1.26; 1,000 large do, and Wilmington, \$1.30 delivered; 350 bbls. Tar, \$1.68 in yard, 375 Spirits Turpentine, (part taken by receivers), 36 a 37, and in lots as wanted, 37 1/2 a 38 cash. The total receipt of all descriptions, since our last, is 25,000 bbls. one half of which is in Rosin.

Rice.—Had been in fair request and we note sales of 450 tons at \$3.12 1/2 a \$3.50, cash.

CHARLESTON MARKET. April 23. Cotton to-day's sales amounted to 600 bales, at our quotation. The market closing in favor of buyers.

LIVERPOOL MARKET. By the Arg. Cotton had declined 1/4 on middling quality, and 1/2 on better descriptions. Fair Uplands, 7 1/4; Orleans, 7 1/2; Rio de Janeiro, 7 1/2. The sales of the week amounted to 28,000 bales, of which Speculators took 10,000, and Exporters, 900. The sales on the 12th were 4,000 bales—all to the trade.

The cotton crop was estimated, on accounts signed by every factor at New Orleans, except one, at a little over two millions of bales.

Produce generally unchanged. Corn has advanced 1/2. Sugar and Molasses are in fair demand. Provisions have slightly declined.—Business in the Manufacturing Districts is dull.—Money is plentiful.
