PRODUCTION OF SILK IN FRANCE. From the article published in Paris Moniteur. it appears that the production of raw silk in France was in 1820, 1,200 000 kilogrammes; in 1830, 1,500,000 kilos, 1870, 2,000,000 kilos, and 1850, 2,500,000 kilos. The production for the present year is estimated by some authorities at 3 000 000 kilos, but others suppose this to be an exaggeration. In 1811, the produce of the co-coons was 3 998 134 kilos, in 1820, 5 229 896; in 1830 7 678 487; and in 1841, 11 549, 268. Thus the increase has been constant but it has not kept pace with the consumption. It is proposed that the Government shall give encouragement to this branch of industry in order to relieve the country from the necessity of obtaining supplies of silk from abroad.
