RIOT IN NEW ORLEANS.

The New Orleans Crescent contains the following account of the scenes that transpired in that City on the 21st ult., on the reception of the news from Havana.

We never new a community more excited than was ours, yesterday. Horror, rage and indignation seized it on the announcement of the brutal massacre at Havana. The sight of hundreds with cups upon their arms, the tolling of bells, the discharge of minute guns, made every thing dismal and quickened the fiercest passions in life.

They found expression in the bitterest words, none tatter of hissing venom and loathing, than those used in speaking of our Consul at Havana. His conduct was a disgrace to our country and humanity; and if our Government do not at once remove him, it will disgrace itself.

Yesterday New Orleans was alive with excitement and movement. The streets were thronged with people, and angry and violent crowds paraded through the city, breaking into the cigar and liquor shops kept by Spaniards, gutting them of their contents, and destroying every thing they could lay hands upon.

The melancholy news of the fate of Crittenden, Kerr, Brandt and their companions, met, early in the morning a deep shade of gloom over the community. The several hundred filibusters now in the city immediately put on crape. Up to 11 A. M. no sign of disorder was manifested.
