

RACHAEL SPEER. From the Norfolk Beacon of Tuesday last. SEABOARD AND ROANOKE RAIL

ROAD.

This road has been re-constructed as far as Garysville, about a mile and a half from Weldon N. C., and will commence running with the Southern line via the Wilmington Rail Road next Monday, conn cting with it for the present, from Garysville by means of the Petersburg and Roanoke Railroad.

The Company has authority by its charter, to condemn by a writ of ad quod damnum, the bridge at Weldon, as it were land over, which the road should run, and applications was to be made yesterday to the Court of Northampton county, North Carolina, for the issuing of a writ to empanel a jury in the case.
