SENTIMENT AT THE NORTH.

A gentleman of South Carolina, on his first visit to the North, writes from the interior of New York to the Greenville Patriot as follows:

"I was told before I left home, (and believed it) that I should have my feelings, as a slaveholder, constantly outraged by the universal sentiment which was said to be universally prevalent here. But I must confess I have been most happily deceived; I have met with but one man who has, in a manner of still disagreeable, approached me on the subject of slavery, and he was denounced by all who knew him here as a miserable fanatic, while the general sentiment, in this locality at least, is what it should be."

"A few days since, a negro girl belonging to a family here from North Carolina eloped with a free negro of this place. The citizens at once assembled and resolved to send officers in pursuit of the fugitive, which resolution was promptly executed, and this morning the girl was restored to her owner, and the paragon safely lodged in prison to await the proper action in his case. This is but one of the many indications that have come within my knowledge of the sense of justice to the South, and the return of the right feeling here on sectional subjects."

Death from the Bite of a Rattlesnake.

William Lovatt, who was yesterday bit by a rattlesnake, which he kept in his house as a curiosity, died about three o'clock this morning from the effects of the poison. He endured the most horrible tortures from the time he was bit until death relieved him—His limbs and body were awfully swollen, and turned black. Three physicians were in attendance, but their applications failed to have the least effect.
