The Od Fellows, Temperance, and Masonic Americans, as well as the people, have done, and continue to do, their duty in this respect; but I regret to say, the panking and monied it estitutions (with but three or four exceptions, and the numerous town and aid yeorparation of the United States have done compartively nothing to aid this patrious undertaking.
