'Da's a sister !'



An attempt to break Jail was lately made by the prisoners, in this place, which very nearly succeeded. During the late extraordinary cold weather five of the prisoners were permitted to occupy one apariment-a, peculiarly strong room, on the upper floor, with a double grated window. The iron bars of the grates are two inches wide by three quasters thick.
