As was anticipated in our last report the Corporate authorities of the Town of Wil-mington, in April last, issued their Boode pursuant to their subscription made under the authority of the Legislature of North Carolina, for cent interest powered dollars bearing 6 per cent interest powered another bearing 6 per cent interest payable annually and fedeemable in ten and twenty years which were accepted by the company ac cording to the terms of agreement unde will certain citizens of Wilmington, in January 1850, and confirmed by the Stockholders a 1850, and confirmed by the Stockholders at their meeting at Sunterville, in the same month. Of these Bonds it appears by the Treasurer's Report \$75,000 were sold on 1st just, by Messrs. Deltosset & Brown, who were appointed by the Bonst of Directors, Agents to make the sales. These sales were all at par value, and it is believed that if ar rangements are not already consummated they soon will be, to dispose of the remaining \$24 500 on the same terms.

The proceeds of these hoads were specially appropriated by the meeting of Stockhol-ders in January last, for the purchase of Iron to be delivered in Wilmington. A con-tract for 3000 tons of Iron rails was made in April last with the Ellbervale Com A pril last with the Elibervale Company in be delivered in Wilmington during the month of November last, and the present month.--The contract is herewith submitted for your examination.
