

The whole amount expended upon the work up to the date of the report, has been \$397,860 42. The amount collected, as reported upon the capital stock of the company, including contracts not completed and not credited to contractors, is \$724 356 76 Of this sum, the collections have been on the subscription of the State

The company suffered a loss of about \$8.537 50 on the sale of the South Carolina railroad stock, which has sales beganners than made up by the dividend received on the balance remaining in their hands. This ballance the company do not mean to dispose of at present, as the increased receipts of the South Carolina railroad give assurance that the stock will also increase in value.

Of the bonds subscribed by the town of Wilmington, \$75,500 were said on the 1st ipst. These sales were at par value, and it is believed that the remaining \$24,500 can be disposed of on the same terms.

The proceeds of these bonds were especially appropriated by the meeting of stockholders in January last, for the purchase of iron to be delivered at Wilmington.
