

Cotton—The market is firm with a good inquiry at full prices. The receipts at all of the shipping ports since Sept. 1st are 2,787,822 bales, against 2,142,498 for the same period of last year, showing an increase of 645,324 bales. The sales have been at a 10c.

Naval Stores—The market has been more active for crude Turpentine, but the transactions have not been made public. We noticed in our last review larger sales, now generally supposed to have been at 2 1/2 for Wilmington, and 3 1/2 for North County, in all, probably 6 to 7,000 bbls; 700 bbls Wilmington sold to-day at 3 3/4; Spirits are steady at 4 1/2 for large and small parcels. The sales to-day were 250 bbls. About 800 bbls Rosin have been sold at 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 for North County; 1,324 and 1,385 for Newbern, 1,374 and 1,40 for Wilmington, and 2,874 and 3 for No. 1 and prime white 800 bbls Tar, in order, brought \$2.

Flour—The sales for home use are within the range of 5,124 and \$5 per bbl for common to good retailing brands extra and fancy family flour.—Rye Flour—sales at 3 1/2. Shippers offer less.—Corn meal is scarce, with a steady demand for shipment, at 3 1/2 for Penna., and 3 1/2 to 3 3/4 per bbl for Brandywine.

Corn is in steady demand, and 13,000 a 20,000 bushels sold at 6c for Penna. and Southern yellow and 6 1/2 for White.

Naval Stores—About 2000 bbls Rosin sold at 1,374 for Common, and 1,50 a 2 1/2 for Soap; Tar is scarce; a sale of Pitch at 1 1/2 per bbl, Spirits Turpentine is lower. Wharf sales at 42 a 43c, and from store at 44 a 45c per gallon, cash and time.

Liverpool, May 8.—The sales of Cotton in Liverpool on Saturday the 8th were 10,000 bales, of which one half was for speculation and export.—Prices were unchanged but firmer. No change in Flour and Grain. Rice was firmer.
