Apparent Death and Premature Interments. To the Editor of the New York Daily Times: The extract in your paper of the 4th inst, relative to the extraordinary case of the Rev. W. Tennant, brought vividly to my recollection the deep interest with which I had read the brief memoir of his life, to which you refer. In the copy in my possession, however, the author is said to be Ellis Boudinot L. L. D., instead of Dr. Alexander. I have thought that perhaps your readers would be interested if I copied therefrom a further extract, in which the effect upon Mr. T. is stated, and also his own account of what he felt, saw and heard during his apparent death--May it not truly be called what some other revelations impudently pretended to be? A voice from the Spirit World?

"After Mr. Tennant was able to walk the room and to take notice of what passed around him, on a Sunday afternoon the pastor, who had stayed from Church to attend him, was reading in the Bible, when he took notice of it, and asked her what she had in her hand. She answered that she was reading the Bible. He replied, 'What is the Bible?' I know not what you mean." This affected the sister so much, that she burst into tears, and informed him that she was once well acquainted with it. On her reporting this to the brother, when he returned, Mr. Tennant was found, upon examination, to be totally ignorant of every transaction of his life previous to his sickness. He could not read a single word, neither did he seem to have any idea of what it meant. As soon as he became capable of attention, he was taught to read and write, as children are usually taught, and afterwards began to learn the Latin language, under the tuition of his brother. One day as he was reciting a lesson in Cornelius Nepos, he suddenly started, clasped his hands to his head, as if something had hurt him, and made a pause. His brother asking him what was the matter, he said; he had felt a sudden shock in his head, and it now seemed to him as if he had read that book before. By degree his recollection was restored, and he could speak the Latin as fluently as before his sickness. His memory so completely revived, that he gained a perfect knowledge of the past transactions of his life, as if no difficulty had occurred."

MR. TENNANT'S ACCOUNT. While I was conversing with my brother on the state of my soul, and the fears I had entertained for my future welfare, I found myself, in an instant, in another state of existence, under the direction of a superior Being, who ordered me to follow him. I was accordingly waited along, I know not how, till I beheld at a distance an ineffable glory, the impression of which on my mind it is impossible to communicate to mortal man. I immediately reflected on my happy change, and thought--'Well, blessed be God! I am safe at last, notwithstanding all my fears.' I saw an innumerable host of happy beings, surrounding the inexpressible glory, in acts of adoration and joyous worship; but I did not see any bodily shape or representation in the glorious appearance. I heard things unutterable. I heard songs and halcyons of thanksgiving and praise, with unspeakable rapture. I felt joy unutterable and full of glory. I then applied to my conductor, and requested leave to join the happy throng; on which he tapped me on the shoulder and said--'You must return to earth.' This seemed like a sword through my heart. In an instant, I recollect to have seen my brother standing before me, disputing with the doctor. The three days during which I had appeared I feel, seemed to me to be not more than ten or twenty minutes. The idea of returning to this world of sorrow and trouble gave me such a shock that I fainted repeatedly. Such was the effect on my mind of what I had seen and heard; that if it be possible for a human being to live actively above the world and the things of it, I was that person. The ravishing sounds of the songs and halcyons that I heard, that the very words that were uttered, were not out of my ears when awake, for at least three years."

"I will only add, Mr. Editor, that this account was given by Mr. T. to Dr. Boudinot himself, who vouches for the accuracy of all the facts stated, touching this apparent death and revival. Mr. Tennant was afterwards the Presbyterian Clergyman at Freehold, New Jersey, and was the contemporary of Whitfield.
