BOSTON MONEY MARKET. We make a few extracts from some remarks of the Boston Atlas, relative to money and business in that city last week.

At this season of the year, when the dog star is in the ascendant, but little can be said of the buoyancy of the stock market, or of the inclina-tion of operators to enter largely into business transactions.

transactions. Notwithstanding the general dullness of trade in our city, the present week has exhibited more activity, so far as stocks are concerned, than any of its predecessors for some time past. The prices of the fancies have generally been maintained, while those of the steadier sorts have receded. Money continues abundant, and is to be had at asonable rates, say 51 per cent. at the banks.-The late negociation of our city government, of a rater loan at 41, will have a tendency to still further depreciate rates, or bring into regulsition mortgage loans at a reduced rate of interest.— City 5's have been sold this week at 90%. We see nothing in the transactions of the past month to indicate that money will command higher rates than at present, for some time to come. The required amounts for the fall business may have a rendency to bring up the price to the legal rate, however.
