LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES Passed during the First Session of the Thir " ly-first Congress.

(Public Aur—No. 43.)

AN ACT to amend an act entitled An act to settle an adjust the expenses of the perple of Oregon in defending themselves from attacks and hostilities of Caynes Indianation the years eighteen hundred and forty-seven and eighteen hundred and forty-right," approved Rebroary fourteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That the Secretary of the Treasury pay out of the money appropriated by the act to which this is an amendment, approved February fourteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-ones the amount found due to the persons named in the report of Aaron E. Wait, commissioner to ascertain the necessary expenses mearred by said inhabitants, as the same was communicated to Congress by the Legislature of Oregon, at the second session of the thirty-first Congress.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted. That when a person shall have died, the amount shall be paid to his legal representatives, of the production of authenticated copies of the appointment: Provided, That if such decended person shall not have been a resident of the Territory at the time of his death, and shall have died, the second shall have death, and
