Public Acr-No. 641

AN ACT to constitute Allon, in the States of Illinois, a port of delivery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of Ancrica in Congress assembled. That Alton, in the State of Illinois, shall be, and is hereby constituted a port of delivery, and shall be subject to the same regulations and restrictions as other ports of delivery in the United States; and there shall be appointed a surveyor of customs to reside at said port, who shall, in addition to his own duties, perform the duties and receive the salary and emoluments of surveyor, prescribed by the act of
