## THE SMYRNA AFFAIR.

HALIFAX, August 16.-The steamer America arrived this afternoon, bringing Liverpool dates of the 6th inst., and 174 passengers.— She passed the Arabia going in.

ENGLAND. Lord John Russell had brought forward in Parliament his plan for the settlement of the Jamaica grants.

Lieut. Maury had explained his wind and tide theories to a meeting of Liverpool merchants and had been cordially received. RUSSIA AND TURKEY.

The Eastern question was nearly decided one way or the other, but the aspect of affairs did not look promising of peace. The Czar's final answer could not be known until the 12th of August. If he accepted the propositions of the three powers, his troops must be withdrawn from the Principalities. The conference at Vienna, in pursuance of arrangements, will conclude a treaty to protect Turkey, at all hazards, for all time to come. If the Czar refuses the aftimatum, or evades reply, the allied flee's will enter the Bosphorus, and further active measures be taken to maintain the integrity of Turkey.

The Indian Battle-- Defeat of the Sioux Indiaus -- Five Hundred Reported as Killed. LOUISVILLE, Aug. 15 .- A returne! Californian, who has reached Intependence. gives the following account of the Indian battle, before reported as having occurred between the Sioux and Pawnee Indians.

The Sloux were aided in the war by the Cheyennes Indians, and the combined forces were about 5,000 strong. The Pawnees were assisted by the Iowas, Sacs and Pottawattomies, numbering in all about 3 000.-The opposing forces met about fifty miles from Fort Kearcey, and the battle lasted all day, resulting in the loss, on both sides. of from five to six hundred killed. Continued Dreadful Mortality and Increase of the Fever-Great Distress.

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 16, P. M.-The yellow fever continues fearfully on the increase. The Board of Health report two hundred and thirty-two deaths during the past twentyfour hours, ending at six o'clock this morning. Considering that so many have already died, and the population being thinned by all who have the means, of leaving the city, this mortality is unprecedented.

The distress and suffering which exists among all classes, and especially the poor, the sick and dying, are beyond the power of language to describe. In one house, five of the family lell victims. The survivors are unable to bury the dead, and in some instances corpses have been lying until they have become putrid. The whole city is a solemn scene of funerals and death: There seems to be no hope of an abatement of the dreadful scourge, but, on the other hand, it is fearfully increasing, amounting almost to a plague.
