Besides the prospects for copper, there are findications of lead and silver, tin, cobalt, and chrome; not to mention iron ores, manganese and gold, which have long been known to exist in the country. A lend mine, unless abounding in more silver than could be expected, will not be a profitable business in these parts for some years to come; but coball and chrome are not to be passed unnoticed; and especially a tin mine would be a certain fortune to the owner, no tin having ever been found in any quantity on this hem-

We know not what the future may bring but if Mr. Faber's very moderate estimate should be realised, the western part of North Carolina is destined to be the richest mining district in the United States; and we sincerely hope that our citizens will proceed with energy to develope their prospects; and that if possible without the aid of speculators. who are sure to do the greatest injury to the country while they fill their own pockets.

We would suggest to all persons intending to test their prospects by sinking shafts or driving tannels, the good policy of consulting competent person, as to how and where to hegin their operations; as by so doing they may save much time and unnecessary ex-
