THE EASTERN QUESTION.

The London Times, of the 14th, announres that the Czar had rejected the Vienna note as modified by the Sultan, and that war wormed inevitable. The Reglish and French Cousuls had left Jussey, an act which had occasioned great alarm.

Gen. Luders with a fresh corps of Russian troops, was advancing into Moldavia.

The Emperor of Russia was to proceed at once to Warsaw, in order to meet the Emperor of Austria at Olmutz on Sept. 23d.

The Turkish troops under Omer Pasha, on the Lower Danube, insist on fighting the Russians, and it was feared that the Pasha would be unable to restrain their fanatical TURKEY.

The Porte had contracted for 300,000 win- Groceries, &c. ter coats for their troops.

The Egyptian troops, after being reviewed by the Sultan, would proceed to Shumla. All regular communications btween Constantinople and the Russian ports had been

carried on with unabated vigor. The troops were working night and day on the fortifica-tions on the Danube. The Turkish army in the vicinity of Varna amounted to 90,000 men, with 250 guns, and six batteries of heavy metal. Two Russian regiments arrived at Braila,

Correspondence of the Baltimore Sun. DISBANDING THE FISHING SQUADRON.

Ронтямочти. (N H.) SEPT. 23. 1853. The ceremony yesterday of striking the broad pennant worn by Com. SHUBRICK as commander-in-chief of the eastern or fishing squadron, was beautiful and touching. At meridian all the officers of the flag ship Princeton met the Commodore in his cabin, and after the kindest expressions on both sides all PREEMAN AND HOUSTON, WILMINGTON, N. C. hands were called on the deck, and the Commodore and Staff went over the sides. As the barge dropped to the stern of the ship a salute was fired, and at the last gun the broad pennant was hauled down. The Commodore stood in his boat uncovered ; the Princea long distance from the ship before silence was broken in that leave-taking company. The sloop-of-war Cyane also saluted the nodore. It is worthy of remark that this smedore Shubrick was a lieutenant on board the Constitution.

The ships of the fishing squadron have done themselves great credit by the activity and energy and thoroughness with which they have cruised in the fishing grounds resorted to by the Americans fishermen. Not a place has been left unvisited; and yet not complaint has been heard. The fishermen are obeying the treaty of 1818, as it is their duty to do.
