ARRIVAL OF THE STEAMER ASIA THREE DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE

Affairs in the Bost - The War Making but Little Progress - A New Conference Proposed by Austria - The Turks Triumphant in Assa-Insurrection

NEW YORK, Dec. 15 .- The steamer Asia. with Liverpool dates of the 3d inst, arrived this evening. She brings 72 passengers. among whom is G. B. English, bearer of dispatches She passed the steamer America on the 4th.

EASTERN AFFAIRS. The war makes little progress, but fa vors the Turks. No movement of magnitude had taken place along the Danube, but continual skirmishes were occurring between small parties, which sometimes were pretty severe, particularly at the is land opposite Giergero and at Krajava.

In consequence of heavy rains along the Danube extended, military operations, were impossible, and both the Russian and Turkish commanders were getting their troops under cover. Omer Pasha had marched the bulk of his troops back to the quarters they occupied previous to crossing the Danube. The Turks, however, had formed an intrenched camp between Kalafat and Krajova .-- The 4th and 5th Russian Reserve corps are moving from Bessarabia to Wallachia.

It is understood that Austria has proposed a new conference either at Vienna, London or Paris, to which the other powers are said to be favorable. Russia and Turkey will be invited to send delegates. A new manifesto from the Czar was expected.

After the 20th of November, the Turks would seize Russian shipping. The Sultan has declined to receive further supplies of treasure from the Ulemas,

as he does not wish present hostilities to be regarded as a religious war. On the 24th of November Schamyl and

Ismail Pasha were to make simultaneous attacks on the Russian lines; but the result is not yet known. Omer Pasha had intercepted a letter

to keep quiet in the principalities. to Adrianople, and the palace there was repairing to receive the sultan.

The Russians were said to have required from England the recall of Admiral R. Lane and Capt. Borlase, who were holding commands in the Turkish fleet, both of whom hold commissions in the British navy.

In Asia the Turks continue to have the ed the first class fertress of Sincham Kale prople. and fort Usingbeth. Hostilities have also frigate Vlkdicir. A russian ship had captured an Bgyptian steamer after a fierce resistance. The allied fleet remains at its anchorage. It is reported that the Turkish fleet intends to bombard Sebastopol.

Affairs in Servia had caused the Porte uneasiness. The Servian government demands that the Porte shall give an exequator to the Russian Consul at Belgrade .-The Porte thinks Servia is acting under the influence of Russia, through the Prince of Servia in a note to the Sultan promises strict neutrality.

It was reported in Vienna that an alli ance had been formed between Servia and Montenegro. It was reported that an alliance offensive

and defensive, had been formed by England, France, Sardinia and Spain. ENGLAND.

There is no news of importance from England. The anniversary of the Polish revolution was celebrated in London on the 29th.
