ARRIVAL of the STEAMER ANDES.

FOUR DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE.

The Eastern War-Steamers Chartered by England-Manifesto Expected from the Czar-Reported Battle between the Russians - Operations against the Russians in Asia-Kalafut invested by an Army of

Boston, March 1st. - The steamer Andes has arrived, bringing London and Liverpool dates of February 14th. The Andes goes to New York after dis-

charging cargo, and will return again for the Liverpool mails. The steamer Great B itain arrived at Liverpool on the 14th, in 68 days from Australia. The Cunard Company advertise that in consequence of the Ningara having been to ken by the Government, the Alps will sail

for Halifax on the 18th, in her place. EASTERN AFFAIRS-SANGEINARY BATTLES. At Kulafat the Russians had made an advance movement, but active operations would

not commence till March. It was reported that a serious conflict had occurred at Turne, attended with great loss on both sides. The Turks afterwards fell back on Kalafat.

It is confidently announced that a manifesto, signed by Nesselrode, is shortly expected nt Vienna, in which the Czar will amounce his final intentions.

The Turks were forming a camp of 40 000 men on the sea of Marmora, near Constanti

Gen. Guyon had commenced offensive op erations against the Russians in Asia. Kalafat was invested by an army of 60,-000 Russians. The Cz ir had given orders to his Generals to drive the Tucks out of Lesser Wallachia without further delay.

Day and night warlike preparations were going on in England. The military force to assist Turkey, it is new confidently asserted, will consist of 40. 000 French and 10.000 English troops, the latter, if necessary to be increased to 20 000.

The squadron will consist of 30 sail of ves sels, including 20 screw steamers, 3 paddle steamers and 7 sailing vessels, with a total of 2.000 guns. This fleet, without reckoning the squadron of Admiral Corry, will be the most powerful ever fitted out by Great Brit-
