

NEWS. FURTHER FROM CALIFORNIA.

ARRIVAL OF THE NORTHERN LIGHT. Near \$700,000 in Gold Coin--Arrest and Commitment of Fullbraster Leaders--Removal of Seat of Government--Excitement in San Francisco--Good Mining News--Matters and Shipping--Interesting from Oregon and Washington Territories, &c.

The steam ship Northern Light, from San Juan de Nicaragua, arrived at New York on Saturday, the 23rd inst., bringing California papers to the 1st inst., thirteen days later than those received direct, and of some date as those at New Orleans, of which we were advised by the telegraph.

The Northern Light brings 322 passengers, and about seven hundred thousand dollars in specie, consigned with the Sierra Nevada, which left San Francisco on the 1st inst., at 4 P. M., with 546 passengers and \$700,000 in specie on freight.

Sixty Carthage teams have already been broken to harness at Virgin Bay under the superintendence of Col. G. W. White. The spring wagons are on the ground--and from after the 1st of April passengers and baggage between the Pacific and the Atlantic will be conveyed in them.
