ARRIVAL OF STEAMER BALTIC.

FIVE DAYS-LATER FROM EUROPE.

The Czar's Final Refusal - War to be Formally Declared -- Movements of the Different Fleets-Neutrality of Prussia-Eng. tish and French Friendship-Troops from England Passing Through France-Taking of the French and Turkish Loans. Ac.

NEW YORK, April 4 .- The steamer Balhie has arrived, bringing Liverpool dates of Thursday, March 23. She arrived out on the previous Sunday, having been detained wo days in an ice pack, which took her 300 miles to the south and west. In the channel she passed the Sarah Sands for Liverpool; and on the 25th, in lat. 50 30, long. 23, she passed a steamer, supposed to be the Atlantic, bound cast. . The Europa arrived out on Tuesday.


