IMPORTANT TO DUELLISTS.

Would it not be a good plain to substitate for the modern custom of duelling (under the miscalled "code of honor") with

of attempting to kill a school mistress in his neighborhood, died in the prison of Wethersfield, on Sunday, the 9th inst. He had been confined about two years. The

Howes was a mild, inoffensive young man, about 21 years of age at the time of his sentence. He had always lived on his DR.
