A CAUTION TO SCOLDS The following Act of assembly was passed in Virginia in 1662: "An Act for Puneshment of Scandalous Persons.

Whereas, many babbling women slan der and scandalize their neighbors, for which their poor husbands are often involved in chargeable and vexations suits and costs in great damages.

"Be it therefore enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that in actions of slander, occasioned by the wife, after judgement passed for damages, the woman should be punished by ducking; and if the slander should be so enormous as to be adjudged at greater damages than five hundred pounds of tobacco, then the woman to suffer a duck. ing for five hundred pounds of tobacco adjudged against the husband, if he refuse to pay the tobacco"
